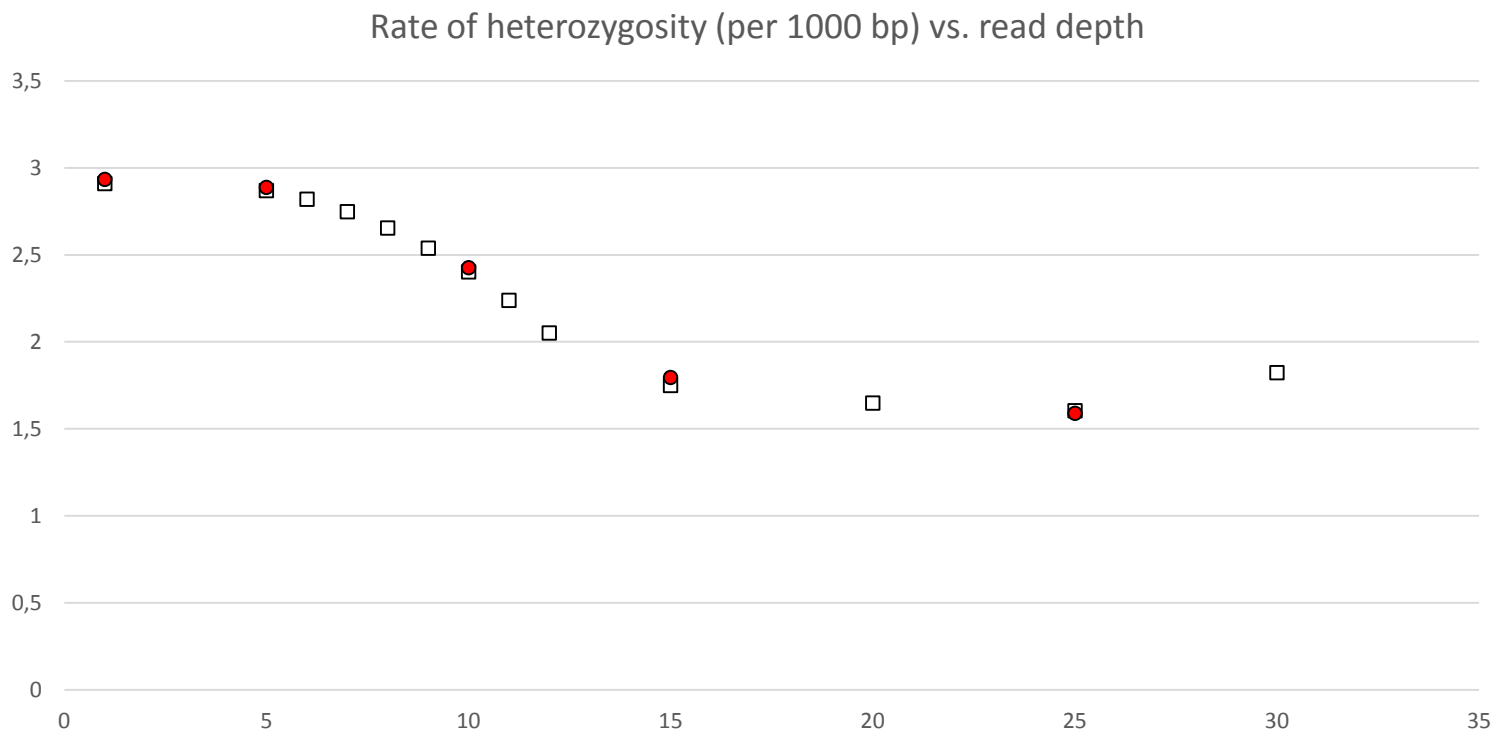

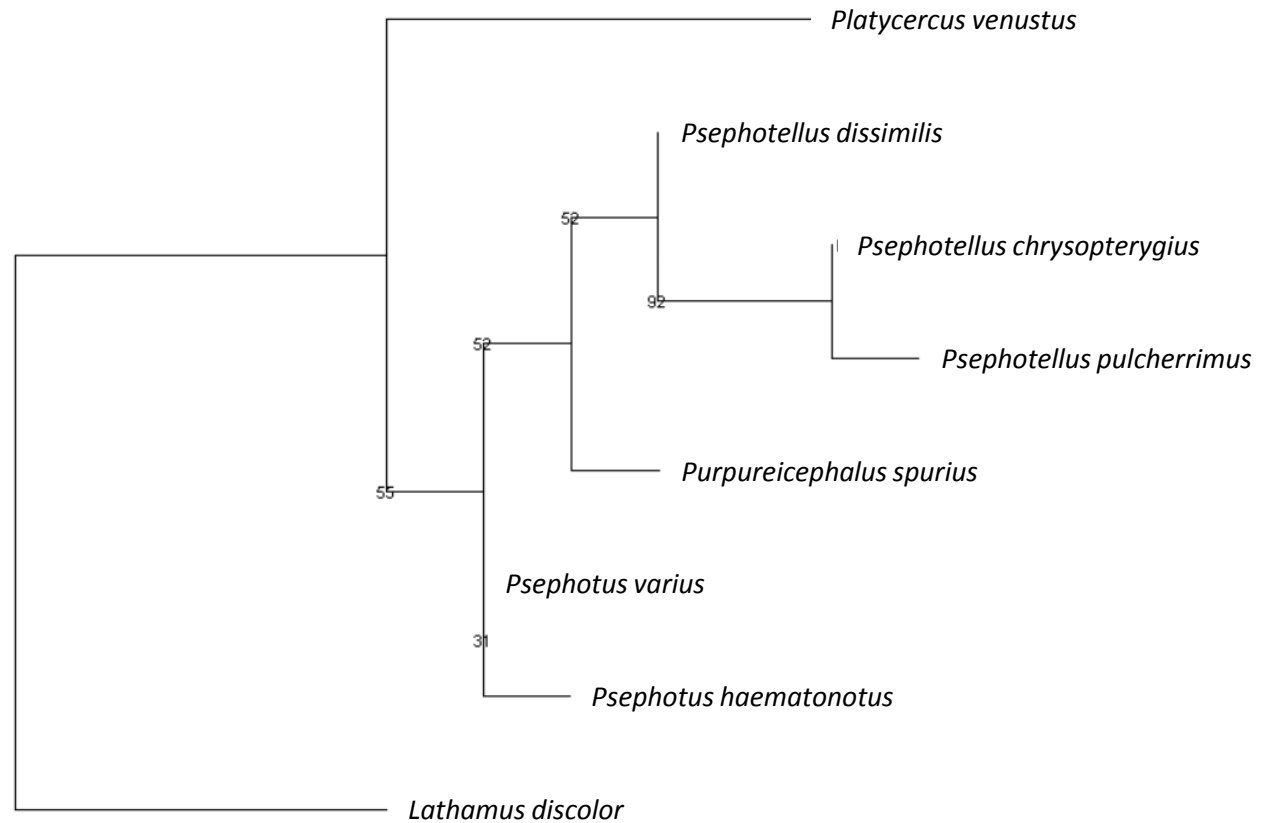

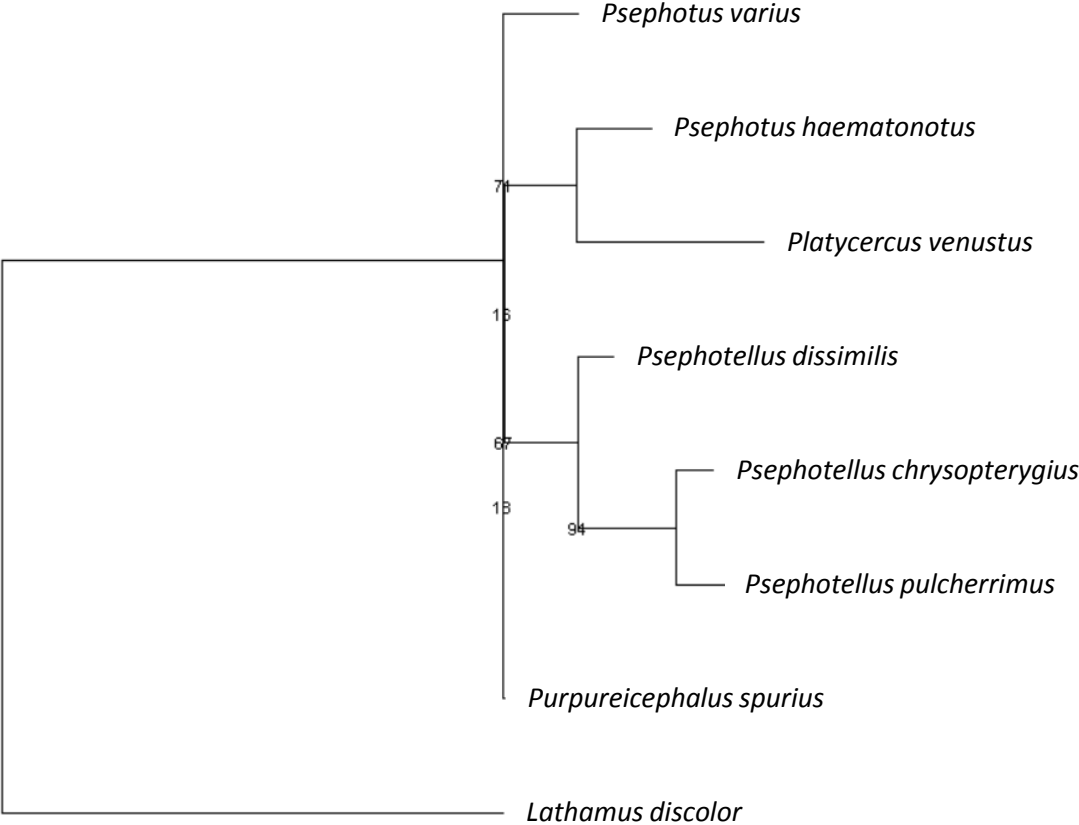

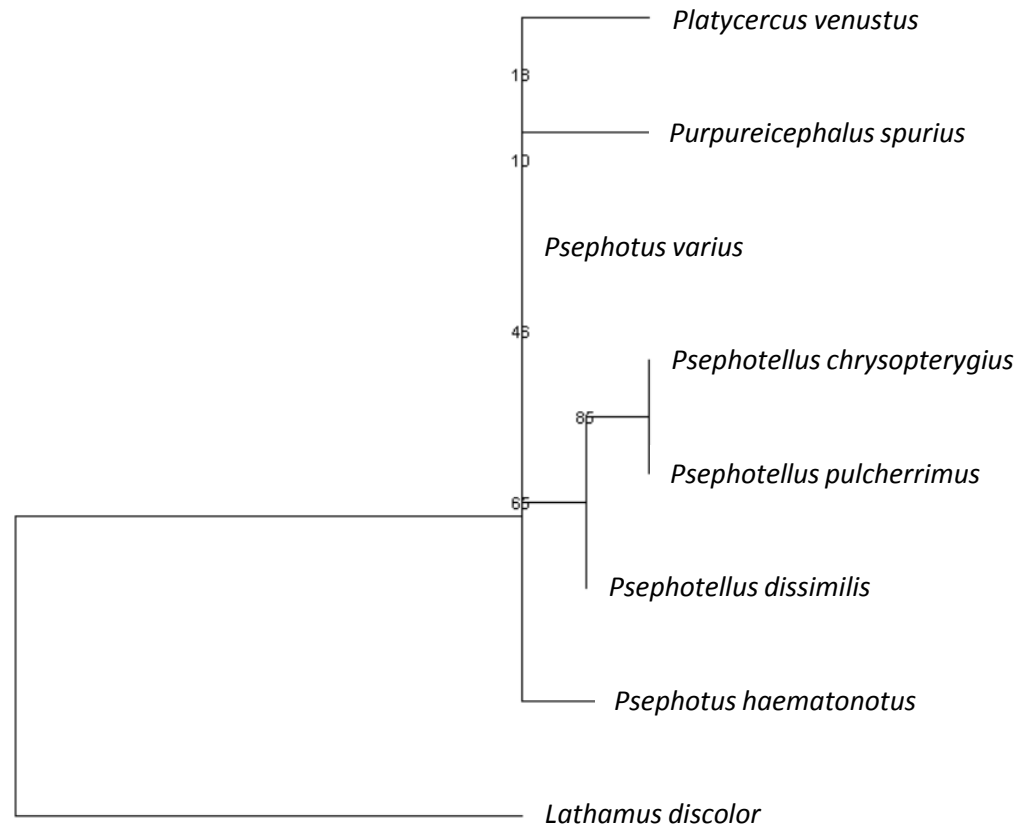

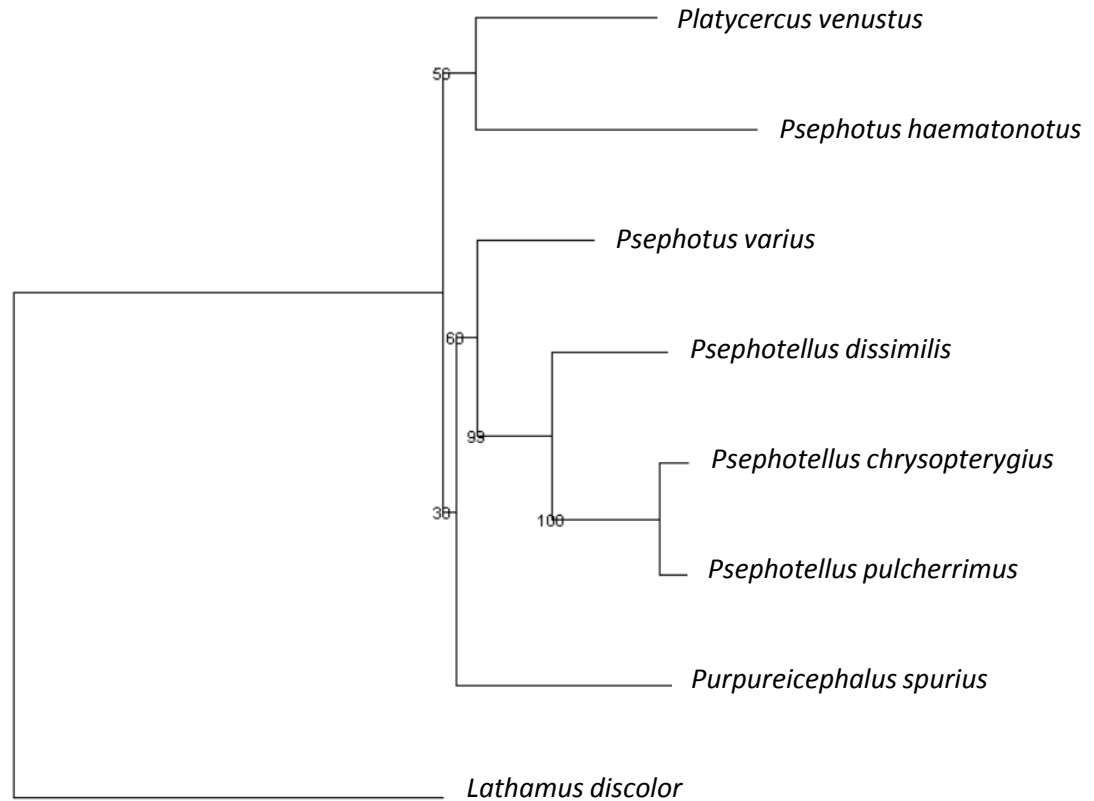

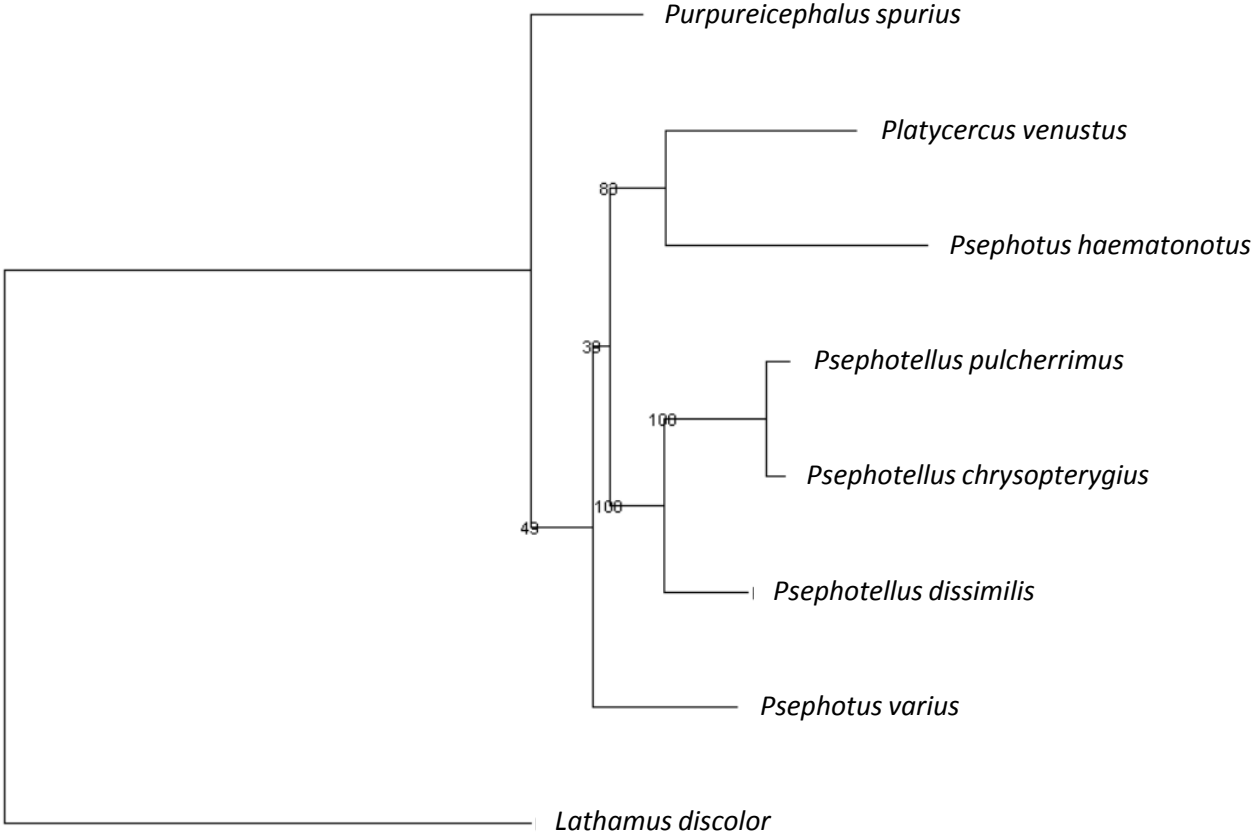

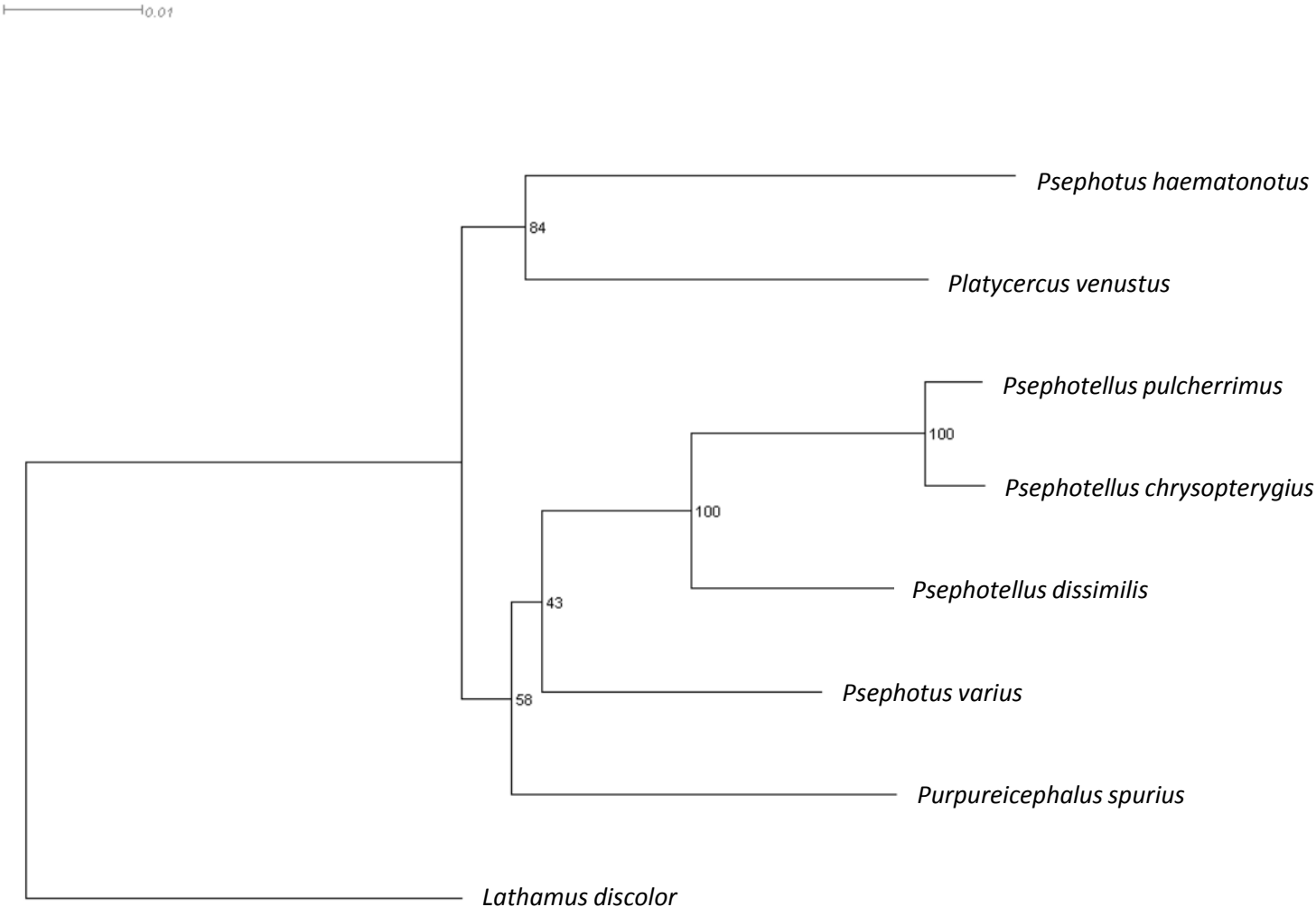


Figure S8. Species tree based on the individual gene trees using MP-EST. Bootstrap values are indicated at the nodes.
