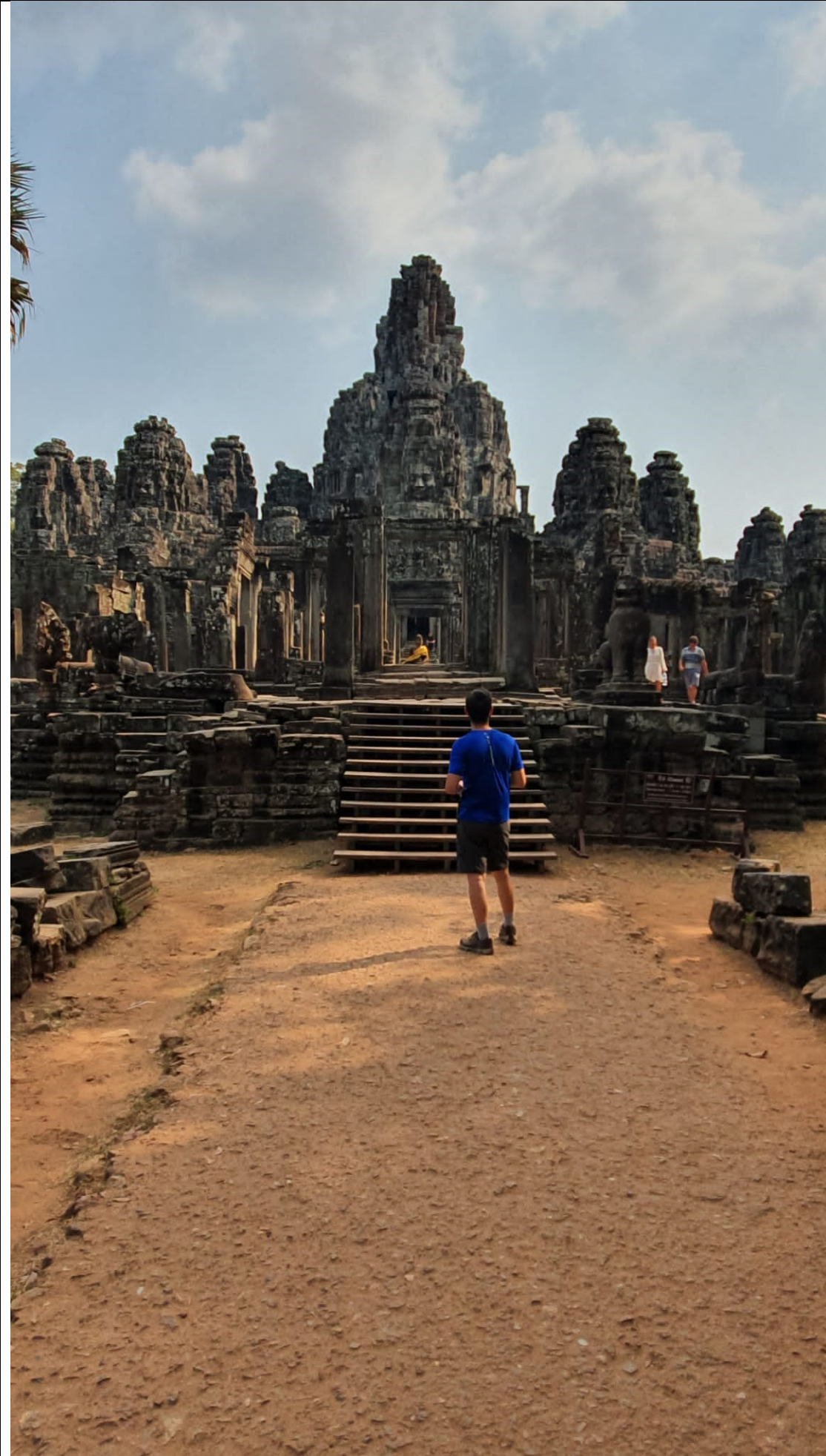

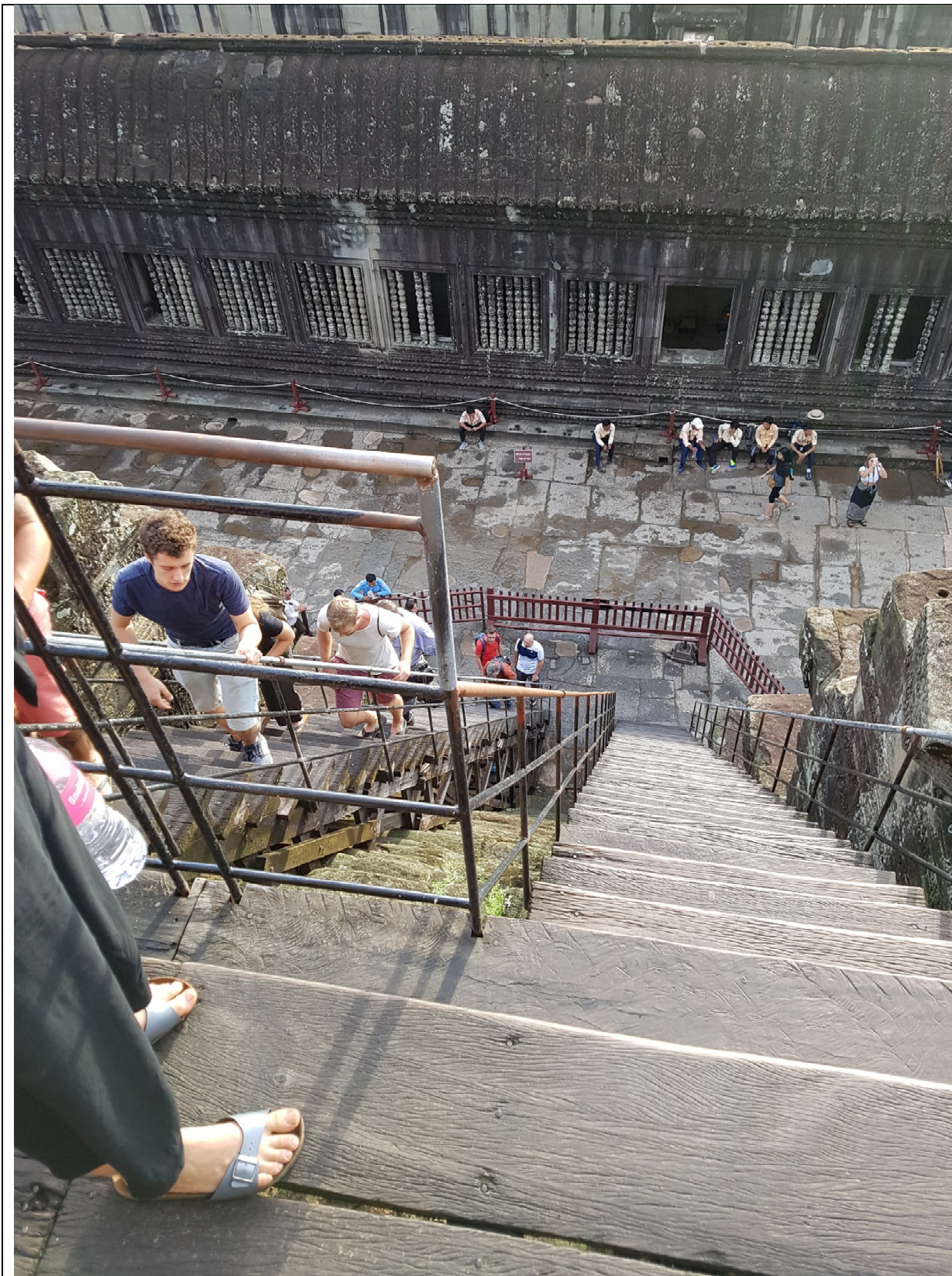

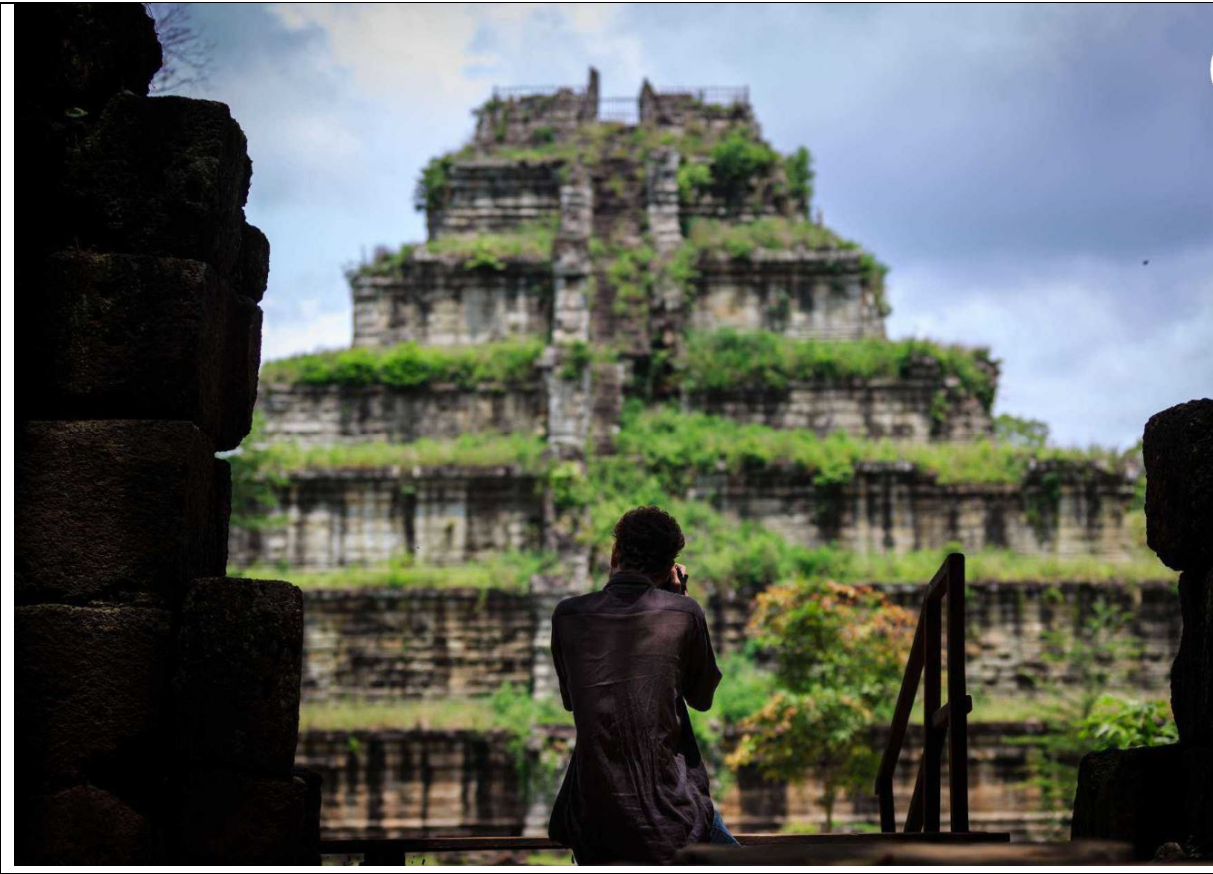

Tickets must be produced by Angkor Enterprise. Visitors who are found without an entrance ticket or with a fraudulent ticket or a transferred ticket are subject to a fine of:

- US\$ 100 for the value of one day ticket
- US\$ 200 for the value of three days' ticket
- US\$ 300 for the value of seven days' ticket and offenders will be prosecuted and handed over to the police.

ENTRANCE TICKETS REGULATIONS

All foreign visitors are required to purchase an entrance ticket to the Angkor Archaeological Park and are three type of the ticket prices as follows:

- One day visit USS 37 (photo required)
- Three days visit and validity of ten days from the issue date USS 62 (photo required)
- Seven days visit and validity of one month from the issue date USS 75 (photo required)

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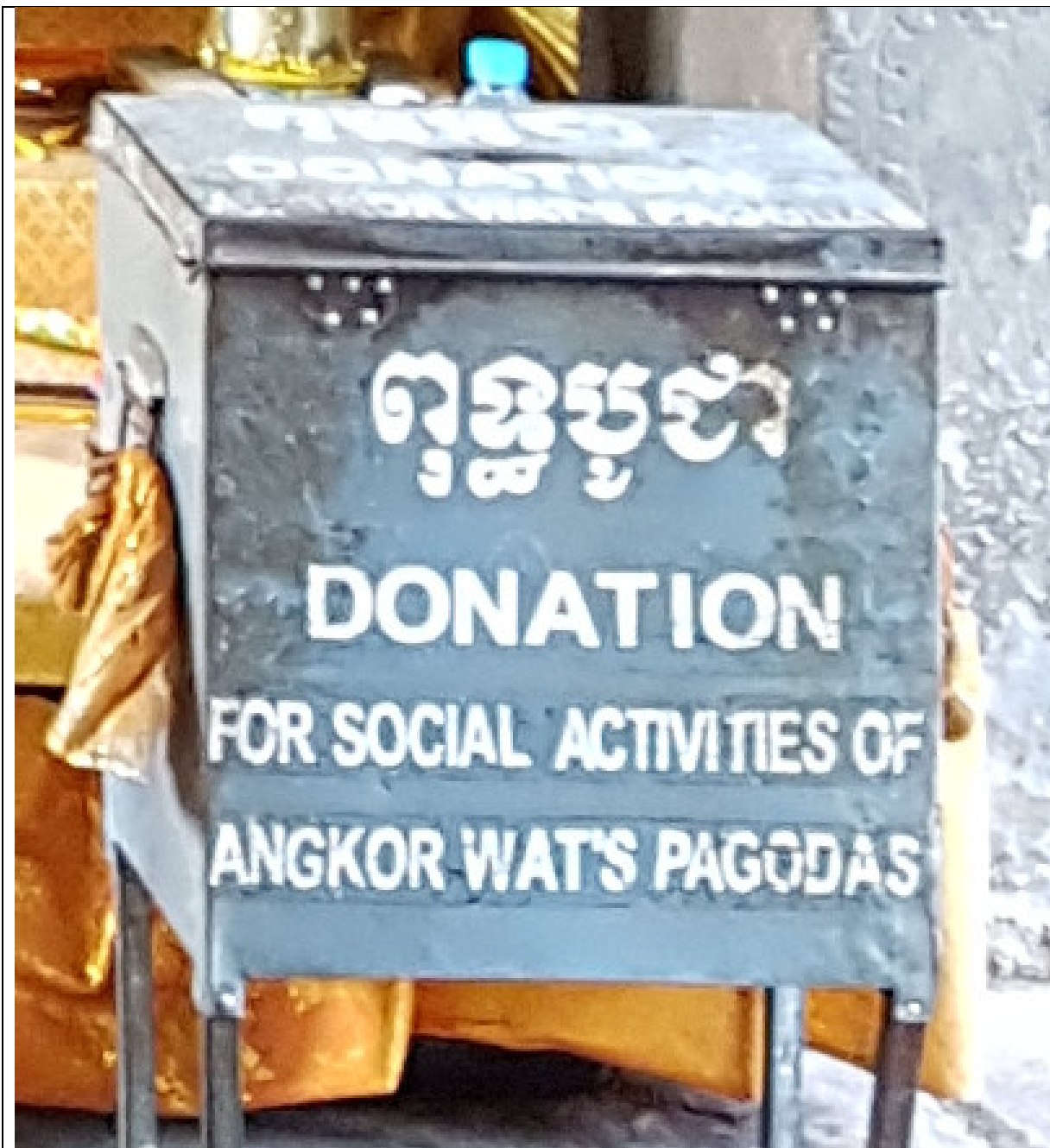

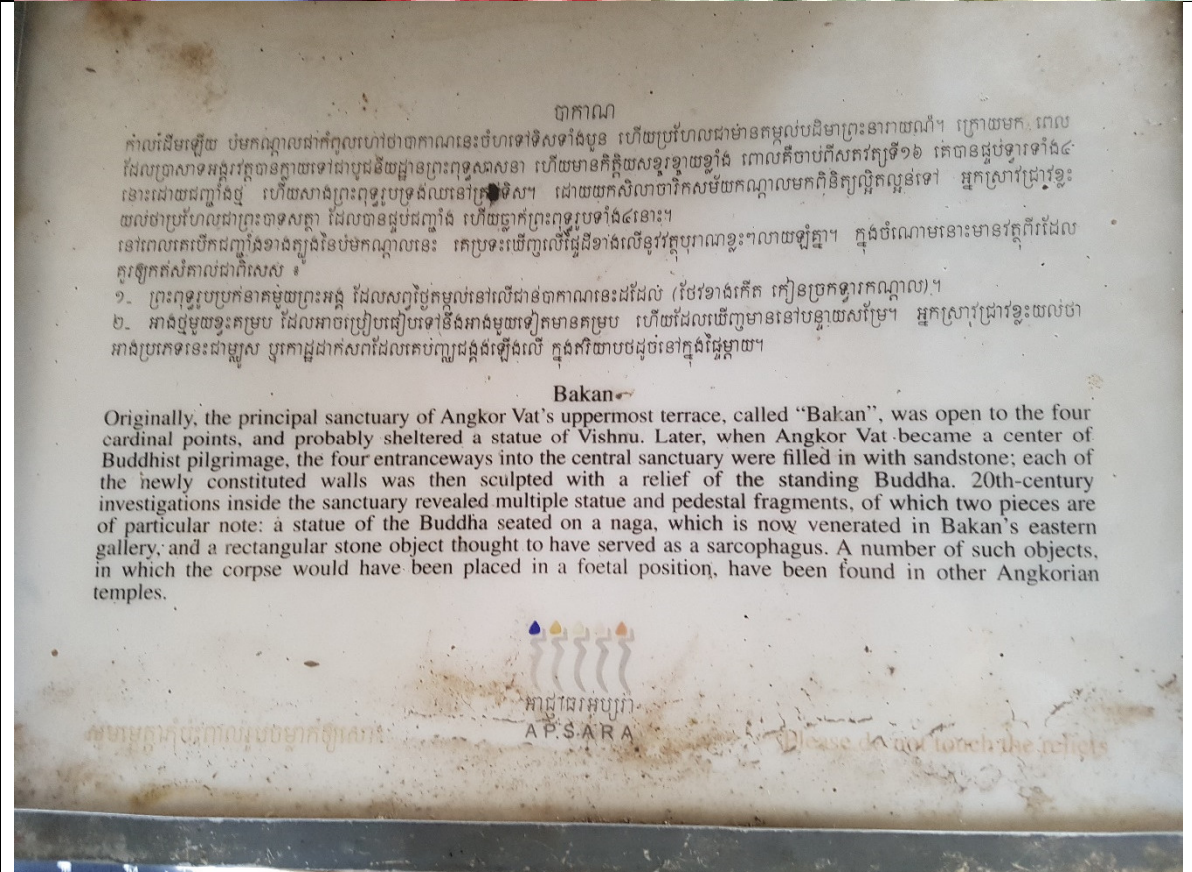

The People Behind the Project

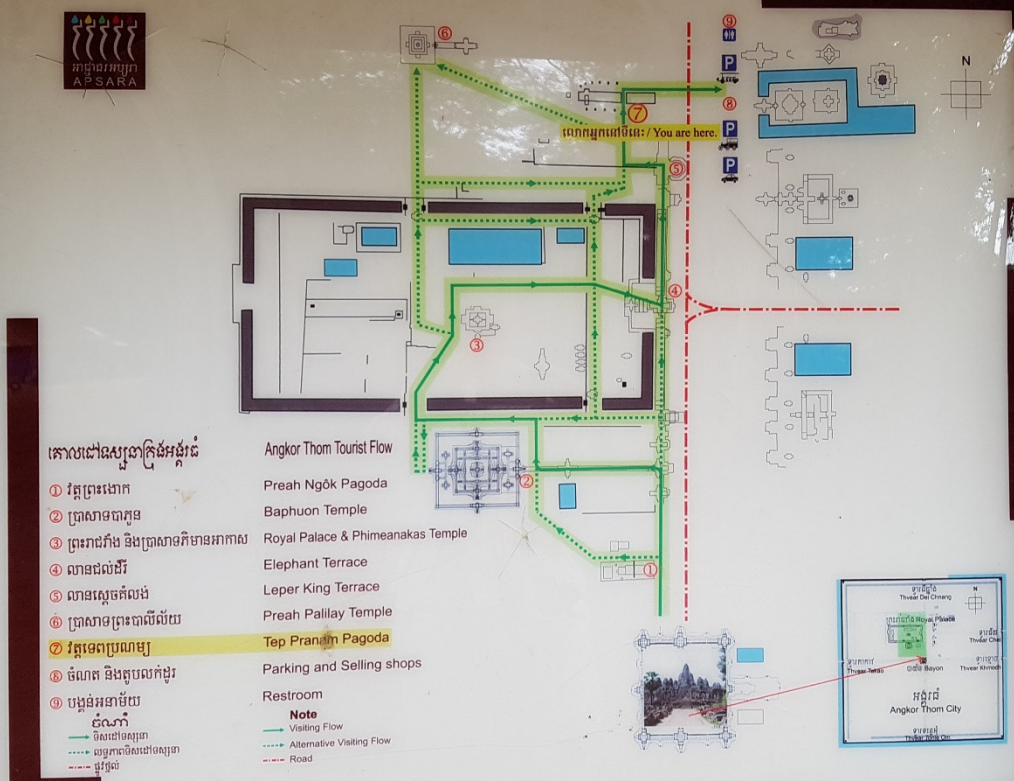
World Monuments Fund began working at Angkor in 1989. Since the early 1990s, WMF's activities have allowed dozens of Cambodian employees to learn alongside international specialists, who have helped WMF develop and implement appropriate conservation programs. Today, the Phnom Bakheng Structural Repair and Conservation Project is carried out by World Monuments Fund's skilled Cambodian staff, with oversight from more experienced Cambodian professionals and in collaboration with foreign experts. It enables the employment of more than 100 full-time workers, most of whom live in the villages within Angkor Archaeological Park, highlighting the deep and lasting connection between the community and its heritage. WMF's local workforce includes individuals who have been employed since the early 1990s and have continued to mentor younger workers over the years.

ANGKOR VISITOR CODE OF CONDUCT

WELCOME TO ANGKOR!

Angkor was the capital of the Khmer Empire (9th to 15th centuries) and once the largest city in the world (12th century). Today, Angkor is still an active spiritual site for Buddhists and citizens who engage in daily worship, prayer and meditation. Angkor is also a living site where over 130,000 inhabitants have lived for many generations.

The APSARA National Authority has been responsible for the conservation and sustainable development of Angkor since 1995. One of our goals is to harmonize tourist experiences with public safety and respect towards our community. This official Visitor Code of Conduct was designed to support this goal. It was developed in cooperation with local communities, visitors, tour guides and restoration teams.

To enhance your experience and to preserve Angkor for generations to come, we kindly urge you to observe the following points:



Sacred Sites

As Angkor is a sacred site, loud conversation and noise and other inappropriate behaviour in Cambodian culture is considered to be offensive and may disturb other visitors. Please keep calm and be respectful.



Restricted Areas

For your own safety and for the conservation of Angkor, please comply with all signs on the site and be mindful of your steps at all times. Do not climb on loose stones.



Smoking and Littering

As a member of the World Health Organization, Angkor has been a smoke free site since 2012. Smoking cigarettes disturbs others and cigarettes can start bush fires. To protect the environment, please do not smoke and litter.



Dress Code

Revealing clothes such as shorts and skirts above the knees and showing bare shoulders are prohibited in sacred places. Respectful dress is strongly encouraged in Angkor.



Candy or Money to Children

Buying items, giving candy or money to children encourages them not to attend school but to beg. If you wish to help the children, please consider donating to a recognised charity.



Monuments

Touching carvings, sitting on fragile structures, leaning on temple structures, moving or taking archaeological artifacts and graffiti are strictly prohibited. Backpacks, umbrellas with sharp tips, tripods and high heels are discouraged from being brought or worn inside the temples.



Monks

Monks are revered and respected. If you want to take pictures, please ask for permission first. Women should not touch nor stand or sit too close to monks.

Any act of looting, breaking or damaging Angkor, or exposing sexual organs and nudity in public area is a crime punishable by law.

WELCOME TO ANGKOR WORLD HERITAGE SITE

The preservation of the temples and their environment helps make your visit memorable while assuring your safety.

To ensure an enjoyable visit, please observe the following regulations:

1. Do not climb on the structures, they are often unstable
2. Do not touch the bas-reliefs and sculptures
3. Do not write graffiti on the stones or trees
4. Do not collect any material such as stones or fragments
5. Do not eat or smoke inside the temples or the surrounding areas
6. Do not use loudspeakers in the temples and their surrounding
7. Do not bring animals in the temples and their surrounding
8. Weapons (guns, explosive, knife, etc.) are strictly prohibited in the temples and their surrounding
9. Filming or taking pictures with professional equipment or for commercial purposes requires a permit.
10. Angkor World Heritage Sites is a sacred area. Please respect this cultural site by wearing appropriate clothing (bare shoulders and shorts are inappropriate).

- 1-Please be appropriately well dressed and pay respect to the site.

- 3-Wear your pass visibly during the visit and hand it over to the Bakan's agent after visiting.
- 4-Length of visit not more than 15 minutes.
- 5-Please make sure to be in good health condition. (Safety is your own primary concern).
- 6-Children under 12 and pregnant women are not allowed to climb.
- 7-People with heart problems are not allowed to climb.

Phnom Bakheng Structural Repair and Conservation Project

Initiated in 2004 to address urgent conditions and carry out emergency repairs, the project has expanded to encompass site documentation and planning, stabilization and long-term conservation, and visitor management. The work has included studies focused on archaeological research, hydrology, and the brick shrines surrounding the main temple.

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Initial funding for the project was provided by the United States Department of State and American Express. In 2008, 2011, 2013, and 2015 the U.S. Department of State contributed substantial funding to support new phases of work. Additional funds have been provided by World Monuments Fund through the Ralph E. Ogden Foundation and the Robert W. Wilson Challenge to Conserve Our Heritage. Throughout the project, APSARA and WMF have contributed funding, personnel, and materials. The total financial commitment to date has been more than \$4,500,000.
