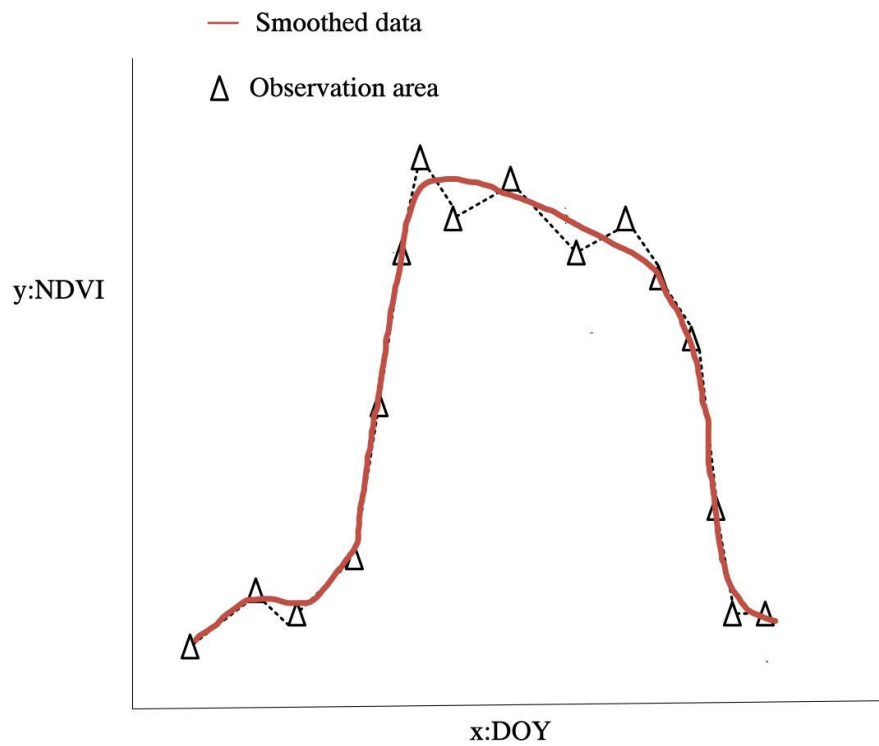


Figure S1. The fitted growth curve from MODIS NDVI data for year i.

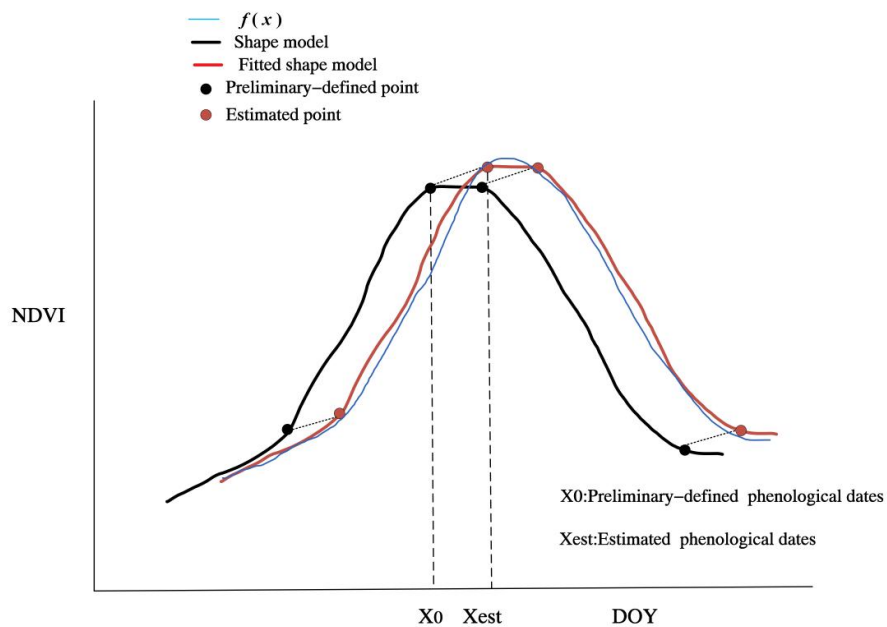


Figure S2. Matching of shape model with growth curve.

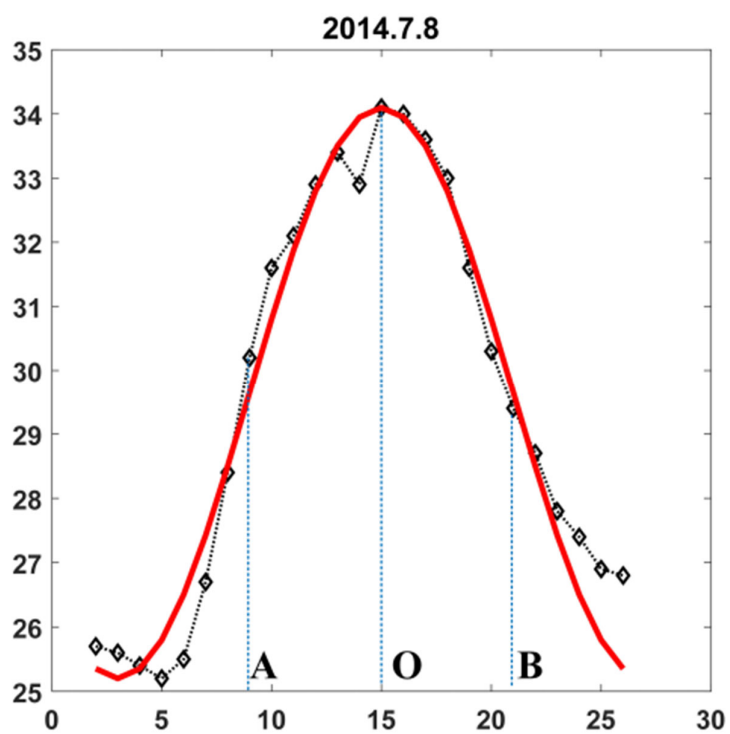
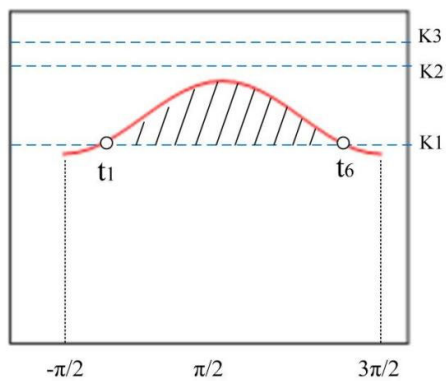
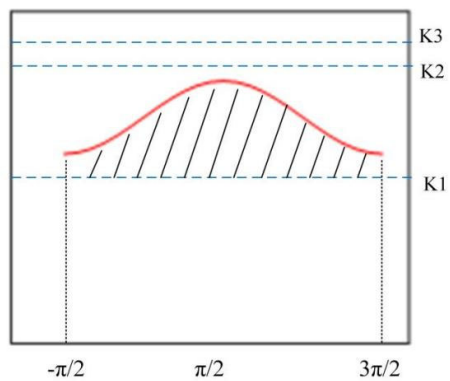


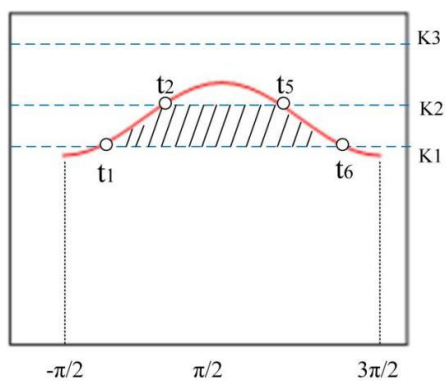
Figure S3. An example of 24-hour temperature fitting.



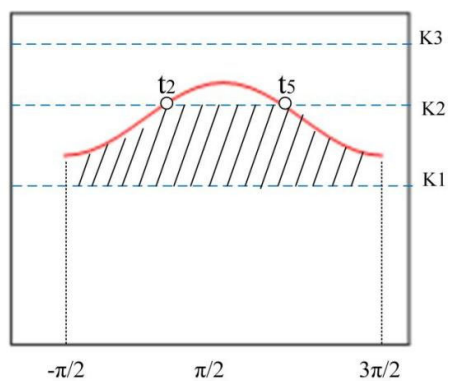

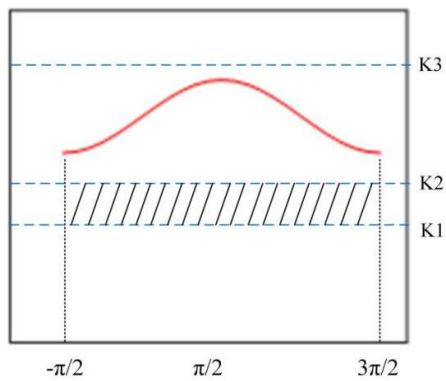

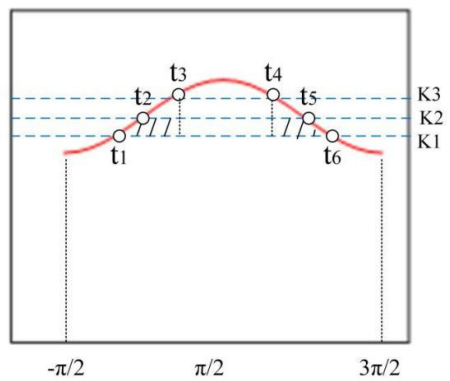

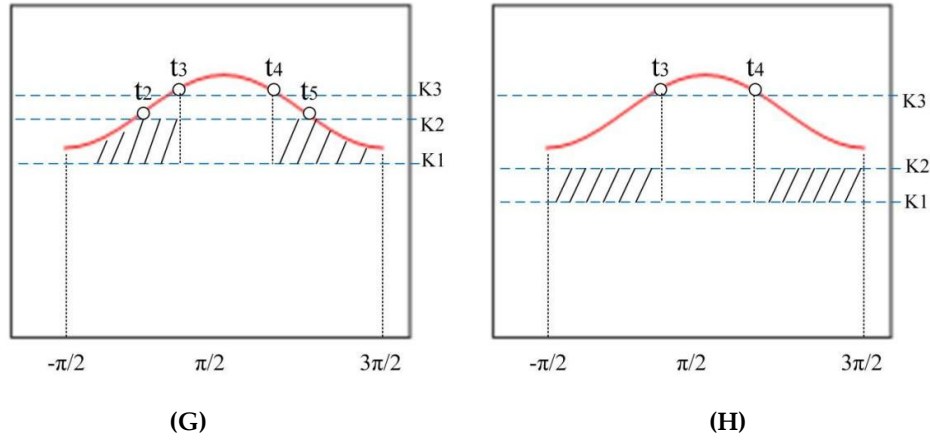

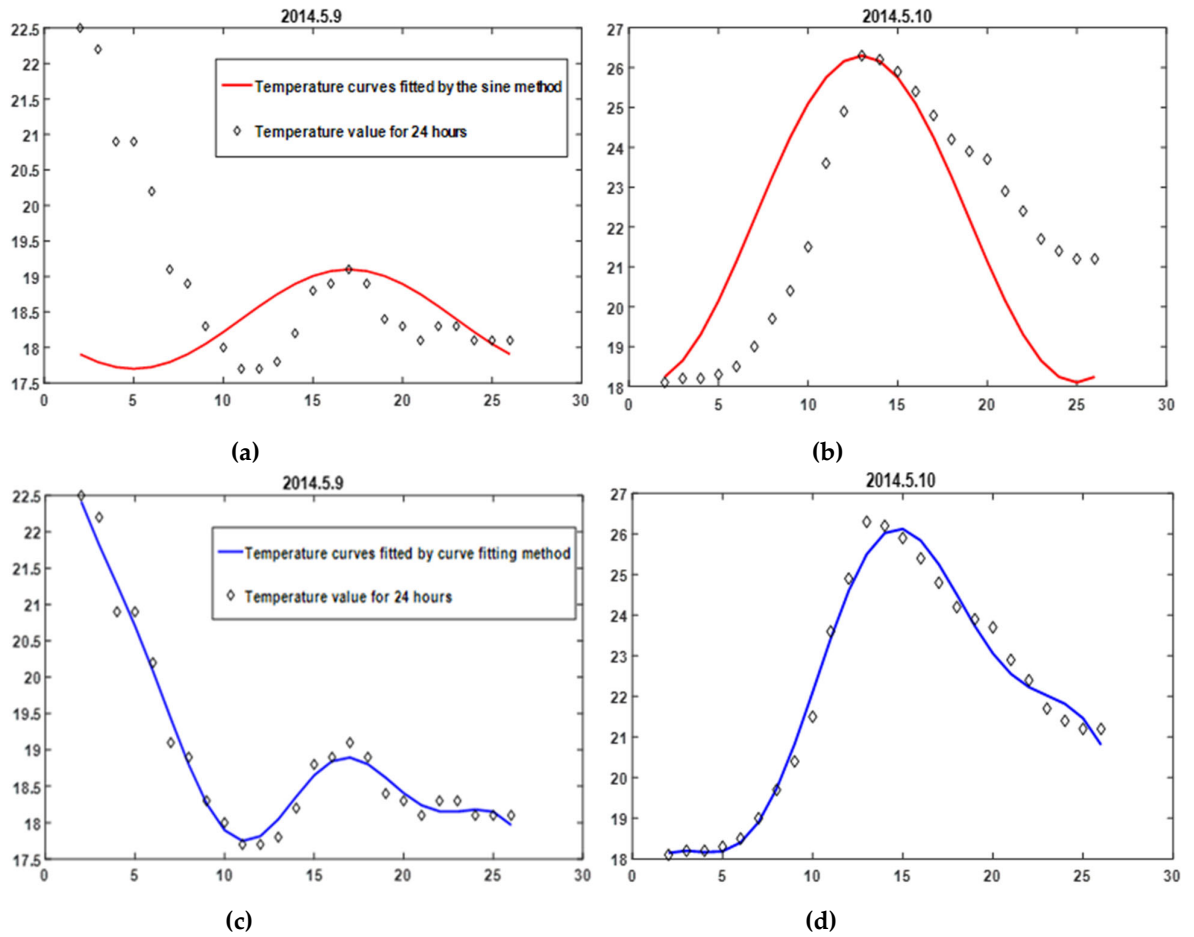
