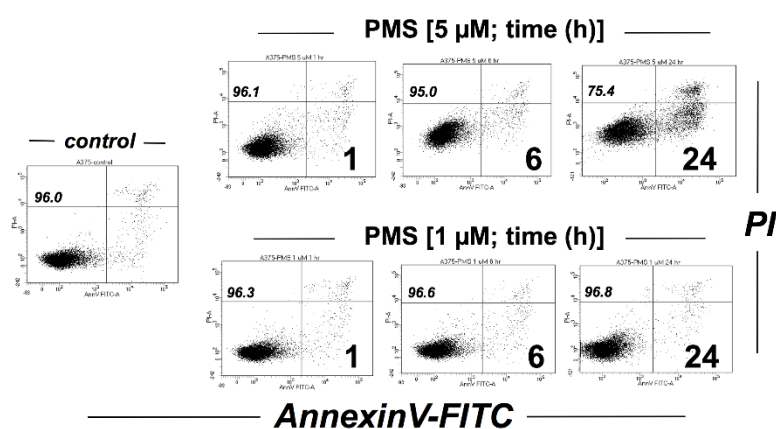

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**Figure S1.** PMS treatment at concentrations as low as 5  $\mu$ M impairs viability of human A375 malignant melanoma cells. Viability of PMS-exposed cells was monitored using flow cytometric analysis (annexin V-PI staining). Time course of cytotoxicity was examined in PMS-exposed A375 cells (5  $\mu$ M, 1-24 h, upper row; 1  $\mu$ M, 1-24 h, lower row). Numbers in quadrants indicate viable (AV-negative, PI-negative) in percent of total gated cells (one specific representative experiment out of three similar repeats is displayed).



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
