 This is due to the way their membrane-targeting mechanisms of action find it more difficult to develop resistance to antibiotics, which generally target macromolecular synthesis.

In addition to applications in human therapy, it would be interesting to include studies on their application in the food industry. Manuscripts that cover other fields of application of substances extracted from plants are welcome.
