Message from the Guest Editor

The limited number of antituberculosis drugs and the quick rise of drug resistance are serious public health threats, demanding the development of novel drugs and regimens for successful treatment. To reach the aim of personalized treatment that accounts for resistance, many molecular assays are under development complementing classical phenotypic methods. In addition to the identification of resistance-associated mutations and epidemiology surveillance, studies of microevolution have resulted in the identification of fitness compensatory mechanisms and the epistatic impact of genetic background on resistance development. The list of resistance determinants is expanding, and further analysis of resistant clinical strains is urgently needed to improve the reliability of molecular methods and our understanding of evolution. This Special Issue seeks manuscript submissions that expand our understanding of drug-resistant tuberculosis, mechanisms, surveillance, and novel resistance; resistance determinants; genome organization; epidemiology and surveillance
