Despite significant achievements in molecular biology, diagnosis, and multi-modal treatment options, most patients are diagnosed with pancreatic cancer at advanced stages, when curative treatment is impossible. Although surgery represents the single hope for long-term survival in patients diagnosed with resectable pancreatic cancer, resection usually implies complex surgical procedures with high morbidity, nonneglectable mortality rates, and disappointing long-term survival. Furthermore, for locally advanced and metastatic pancreatic cancer, the prognosis is even worse. Therefore, identifying new therapeutical options and an early diagnosis appear to be critical for maximizing therapeutic efficacy and avoiding unnecessary aggressive therapies in pancreatic cancer.
