Message from the Guest Editors

After a long history of relatively uncontrolled spontaneous fermentation, fermented products are now expected to fulfill many specific sensorial, nutritional, and safety properties. This can be achieved through the specific biocatalytic properties of the microorganisms used for fermentation. This Special Issue aims to present studies highlighting the specific biocatalytic activities of microorganisms or starters in order to produce specific compounds that bring aroma or texture properties as well as nutritional or safety added value. The clean label use of these specific biocatalysts in non-fermented food is also of interest.
