Message from the Guest Editors

Landslides are one of the main natural hazards affecting the territory globally. These phenomena have relevant direct and indirect impacts over small and wide areas causing fatalities and huge socio-economic damages. Consequently, the interest for the investigation of landslides or landslide-prone areas is increasing, especially in the scientific community where recent support has been provided by the use of new sensors (e.g., drones) or new techniques (Structure from Motion - SfM).
