We live in societies oriented towards the now and the tomorrow, yet the present seems stubbornly rooted in the past, as Zygmunt Bauman so convincingly argues in his last work *Retrotopia* (2017). This retrospective orientation is observable in all major contemporary media forms and social practices. Romantic inclination towards the past might seem irrational, but our emotional connections to our own biographies, as well as a collective solidarity with our childhoods, traditions, imaginations, anticipations and dreams may also be a rational response to modern instability.
