Message from the Guest Editor

Multiple sclerosis is an inflammatory, autoimmune-mediated chronic disease that affects the central nervous system in young adults. There are several major unmet needs in the understanding and management of MS: the neurodegenerative component of MS pathogenesis remains an enigma, novel specific and sensitive biomarkers and imaging techniques to monitor disease activity and progression are needed, and new drugs with high efficacy and a good safety profile are required to stop the neurodegenerative process as well as provide regenerative potential. This Special Issue will focus on recent advances in the pathogenesis, diagnostic/disease monitoring methods, and treatment of MS. We plan to include reviews (updates on the pathogenesis of MS, prodromal multiple sclerosis, biomarkers, high field MRI imaging, novel drugs in the pipeline) and original papers detailing novel biomarkers and clinical research.
