Multiple gestations account for about 3.3% of all deliveries in the United States, with the majority of them being dichorionic diamniotic (DCDA) twin pregnancies. The risk of almost all perinatal complications is increased in multiple destations, mainly preterm birth and inadequate fetal growth. Therefore, twin pregnancies necessitate closer antenatal surveillance in order to improve obstetrics outcome. The scope of this Special Issue is to provide an overview of recent advances in the field of multiple gestations and twin pregnancies with a focus on the clinical aspects of prediction, prevention, and potential treatment of adverse outcome.
