Urticaria is a disorder that still causes many problems in general, allergological, and dermatological practice. Its pathophysiology includes genetic, hormonal, and inflammatory abnormalities. The symptoms of urticaria are undoubtedly the cause of distress for patients, having a detrimental influence on patients' quality of life and resulting in emotional disturbances. Previous analyses proved significant psychological and psychiatric comorbidity in the course of urticaria. Accompanying pruritus often disturbs the sleep cycle.
