The rich dependence structure of these data has stimulated the demand for more complex dynamic models along different research lines. On one side, the larger cross-sectional dimensions—which are easily accessible—pose challenges to the use of multivariate models, with the need of specifying appropriate estimation approaches and/or to impose data- and economically-driven parameter restrictions. On the other side, the data available at high frequency push for the development of data cleaning and data management tools as pre-requisites for time series analyses...

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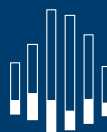
