Marine Natural Products in Crop Protection

Message from the Guest Editor

As in many areas, natural products obtained from terrestrial plants and microorganisms have provided many scaffolds for pesticide development. However, the potential marine organisms in crop protection have remained largely underexplored. Therefore, this Special Issue aims to stimulate research on marine natural products (MNPs) deriving from marine macro-organisms (e.g., invertebrates, seaweeds) and marine micro-organisms to yield new lead compounds for protection of essential crop plants. The main foci of this Special Issue will be on, but not restricted to, the following areas: 1. Isolation and identification of MNPs with biological activity against: • Plant (crop) pathogens (phytopathogens); • Harmful insects; 2. MNPs for weed control (phytotoxicity); 3. Target and mode of action studies on MNPs with fungicide/herbicide/insecticide activity; 4. Omics in the isolation and identification of new MNP agrochemicals; 5. Chemical synthesis and bioactivity studies on marine-originated pesticide lead compounds.

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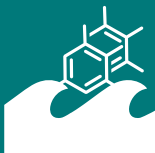


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About the Journal
