BOF steelmaking slag is the major by-product of the converter steelmaking process and contains large quantities of valuable components. With the depletion of natural resources and the deterioration of the environment, the recovery of valuable elements and heat from BOF steelmaking slag is attracting more and more attention. The comprehensive utilization of BOF steelmaking slag has become an urgent problem that must be solved for a low-carbon and sustainable steelmaking process. In recent years, promising technologies for utilizing BOF steelmaking slag have been studied and developed, such as heat recovery from molten slag, phosphorus recovery, recycling as flux agents, slag fertilizer, and the rehabilitation of coastal environments. In this Special Issue, we welcome articles that focus on the current state-of-the-art ideas, methods, technologies, equipment, and theories for the efficient utilization of BOF steelmaking slag. It is aimed to promote the development of a circular economy and improve resource utilization efficiency in steel plants.
