Message from the Guest Editor

"Genosystematics" is using data on the structure of information macromolecules (semantids) to recognize the systematic position and phylogeny of living organisms. Genosystematics started at the turn of the 50s and 60s of the last century. Over its sixty-year history, genosystematics absorbe the methodological innovations of molecular biology-from paper chromatography of nucleotide bases through DNA-DNA hybridization, isozyme, and immunological analysis to high-throughput sequencing of genomes of the second and now the third generation. The progress of genosystematics is inextricably linked with the development of bioinformatics methods. A significant number of genosystematic studies have been devoted to plants, leading to a revision of the concepts of phylogeny and taxonomy of many groups. However, the field for research in this area is still far from being closed. In the current Special Issue, it is planned to publish original research, reviews, and short communications on the genosystematics of various groups of terrestrial plants and algae, as well as on methodological and bioinformatics developments in this area.
