Thermal analysis is an important characterization tool in the field of materials sciences because specific physico-chemical properties of synthetic polymers, biobased polymers, nanomaterials, materials and biomaterials can be determined through thermal analysis. The thermal analysis of materials encompasses a variety of methods including differential scanning calorimetry (DSC), thermogravimetric analysis (TGA), thermomechanical analysis (TMA), dynamic mechanic analysis (DMA), dielectric thermal analysis (DTEA), isothermal titration calorimetry (ITC) and heat transfer analysis to detect changes in material properties as a function of temperature.
