Notably, we are looking at comparisons between Augustine's theory of God, the cosmos, epistemology, moral philosophy, political philosophy, and philosophy of history with similar ideas of the main philosophical and religious branches of East Asian thought, such as Confucianism, Daoism, Buddhism, Islam and Shintoism, and so forth.
- Augustine and the state-church relation in East Asian countries. Augustine's division between the city of God and the city of the earth laid the foundation for the separation between state and church in modern society. We would like to know whether and how his theory influenced the state-church relation in East Asian countries.
- Augustine's influence on East Asian Catholic churches and Protestant churches.
- Augustine and the church unity problem in East Asian countries.
