### Message from the Guest Editors

We invite submissions from established and early career scholars and practitioners that have the potential to contribute new critical perspectives to this salient discussion. While maintaining a necessarily broad remit, some indicative topics for investigation might include: the experience of male victims of street-level Islamophobia; discourse analyses of mainstream political rhetoric; the investigation of 'institutional Islamophobia(s)'; Islamophobia in the context of the Global South; children's encounters with Islamophobia; Islamophobia in the era of COVID-19; and inter-community Islamophobia, e.g., Islamophobia emanating from within Sikh and Hindu communities. Far from exhaustive, submissions may engage with any aspect of the theme of the Special Issue, whether empirically, theoretically, and/or conceptually, and be from any discipline and geographical location.
