This Special Issue focuses on the ecology, diagnosis, and epidemiology of flaviviruses, focusing with a broad focus on recent advances in infection control and vaccine development. Flaviviruses are insect-borne and include Japanese encephalitis, dengue, and tick-borne viruses. They are, therefore, viruses with regional characteristics. Japanese encephalitis, for example, is widely distributed from the Far East to Southeast and South Asia. Worldwide, 30,000–40,000 cases of Japanese encephalitis are reported annually, but the epidemic has already been largely prevented by routine vaccination, including in Japan and South Korea. This Special Issue aims to cover a wide range of the latest findings on flaviviruses involved in their development and research, with the goal of vaccine prevention and infection control.
