Message from the Guest Editors

Poultry meat and egg production are important global agricultural sectors and their importance is projected to rise even further. Current trends include the reduction of antimicrobial use and introduction of alternative commercial production systems to improve animal welfare. Pathology is a key first step to obtaining an accurate diagnosis and also provides samples for diagnostics. A wide range of strategies are applied to prevent and control the spread of poultry diseases, including biosecurity, the compartmentalization of subpopulations, strategic vaccination, monitoring, and surveillance. The aim of this Special Issue is to invite original research manuscripts and reviews on all aspects of poultry pathology and the control of infectious and noninfectious poultry diseases. We call on researchers to contribute recent findings and reviews, focusing on (but not limited to) the following topics: Poultry pathology-Disease control and management-Epidemiology and field investigations-Transmission studies and disease modelling-Case reports. Manuscripts on diseases of all poultry species and commercial as well as backyard poultry are welcome.
